Certificate in Legal Practice

The **CERTIFICATE IN LEGAL PRACTICE (CLP)** is a professional level examination regulated by the Legal Profession Qualifying Board¹, Malaysia

With a CLP qualification, one becomes a 'qualified person' by virtue of Section 3 of the Legal Profession Act 1976², who can then choose to complete their pupillage with a view of being admitted as an Advocate and Solicitor in Malaysia.



The **CLP EXAMINATION (CLPE)** is commonly known for its rigorous, high standards. It serves as the ultimate benchmark of excellence, ensuring that only the most dedicated, highly skilled, and capable candidates enter and elevate the Malaysian legal profession.

The Entry Requirements

The LPQB is a statutory body empowered under LPA 1976 to decide on the requirements for one to qualify to sit for the CLPE.

The *basic* entry requirements for UK LAW DEGREE HOLDERS are as follows:

[1] Achievement at SPM or its equivalent³

- A minimum of 5 credits at SPM level or its equivalent obtained in one and the same examination

AND

[2] Achievement at STPM or its equivalent⁴

- A minimum of 2 principal passes at STPM level or its equivalent obtained in one and the same examination.
- Duration of the STPM course or its equivalent shall be a minimum of 1 academic year.

AND

[3] A recognized law degree⁵

- Studied for a minimum of 3 academic years and a minimum of 12 subjects.
- The 12 laws must include **6 core subjects**, namely Law of Contract; Law of Torts; Constitutional Law; Criminal Law; Land Law; and Equity & Trusts, which each was studied for the duration of 1 academic year.
- For **University of London LL.B** holders, the degree must be completed within 6 years from registration (first year) AND the candidate must have obtained at least a Second Class Lower law degree.

CLP Examination [PSAG]

The CLP Examination, also known as, **Peperiksaan Sijil Amalan Guaman (PSAG)** is conducted **twice (2) every year**:

- The **Main Examination** typically takes place in July/August; and
- The **Referral/Supplementary Examination** (*resit of one paper*) is commonly conducted in October/November.

To register for the CLP Exam, a candidate must:

[1] Firstly apply to LPQB to sit for the Exam.

- The application period usually opens in the month of January. Candidates are required to pay an Application Processing Fees of RM250.00** to LPQB.

[2] Candidates with successful applications, will then proceed to register for the Exam between the months of February – April (year of the Exam). To register, candidates will pay LPQB a total of RM 5,800.00**:-

- RM4, 000.00** being the Registration Fee; and
- RM1, 800.00** as the Examination Fee.

***These fees are stipulated by LPQB & may be subject to change from time to time.*

Starting from PSAG 2021, a registration for the CLP Examination is valid for a **period of five (5) years** only, within which a candidate is entitled to a maximum of **four (4) sittings/attempts**.

Should a candidate fail the Exam after his/her fourth attempt OR should the five (5) year-registration period expires, the candidate will no longer be allowed to re-apply / re-register for the CLP Exam.

CLP Examination [PSAG]

To pass the Certificate in Legal Practice, candidates must sit for, and pass **all five (5) compulsory papers** in a single sitting. There are **no elective** or **optional** papers.

5 Compulsory Papers



Passing Criteria & Re-sit Policy:

Pass 5 papers

- Candidate is awarded the CLP qualification.

Fail 1 paper

- Candidate is granted a **Conditional Pass**.
- Candidate is allowed to **re-sit** the single paper for up to three (3) attempts within the registration period.

Fail 2 or more papers

- Candidate **fails** the Exam.
- Candidate is required to **retake** all 5 papers within the registration period.

Exam Mode & Venue:

The Examination is conducted physically in **Kuala Lumpur** on an annual basis

SUBJECT OVERVIEW: CIVIL PROCEDURE

CIVIL PROCEDURE offers an exploration of the statutory rules and legal practices required to enforce or defend rights, and obligations in civil litigation.



EXAMINATION FOCUS

- ❖ A working knowledge of civil procedural rules in Rules of Court 2012, and related law and practices in relevant statutes and case law.
- ❖ Analytical thinking and flexibility in answering examination questions.

EXAMINATION FORMAT

Seven (7) questions in total. Candidates must answer **four (4)** questions:

- **One (1) unseen compulsory question; and**
- **Three (3) elective questions** (*chosen from the remaining 6*)

Candidates are allowed to refer to the **RULES OF COURT 2012 (ROC)**.

Fresh, unmarked copies of the ROC will be provided during the exam.

Candidates are strictly prohibited from bringing in their own copy of the ROC.

SUBJECT OVERVIEW: CRIMINAL PROCEDURE

The study of **CRIMINAL PROCEDURE** requires a working knowledge and practical application of the various procedural rules, powers and practices involved in criminal matters.



EXAMINATION FOCUS

- ❖ A firm grasp of the **Criminal Procedure Code & Malaysian Penal Code** and related statutes and case law.
- ❖ Analytical and creative thinking in applying the laws to situational-based questions.

EXAMINATION FORMAT

Seven (7) questions in total. Candidates must answer:

- **One (1) *unseen compulsory question***; and
- **Three (3) elective questions** (*chosen from the remaining 6*)

Candidates are allowed to refer to the **CRIMINAL PROCEDURE CODE (CPC)**.

Fresh, unmarked copies of the CPC will be provided during the exam.

Candidates are strictly prohibited from bringing in their own copy of the CPC.

SUBJECT OVERVIEW: GENERAL PAPER

General Paper comprises the study of substantive laws in two key areas of civil law, namely Law of Torts and Law of Contract.



EXAMINATION FOCUS

- ❖ Demonstrate a working knowledge of statutory laws & decided case laws
- ❖ Draft Statement of Claim (for both areas), based on situation given.

EXAMINATION FORMAT

The General Paper contains TWO (2) questions: One on Law of Contract & One on Law of Tort. Candidates must answer both the questions.

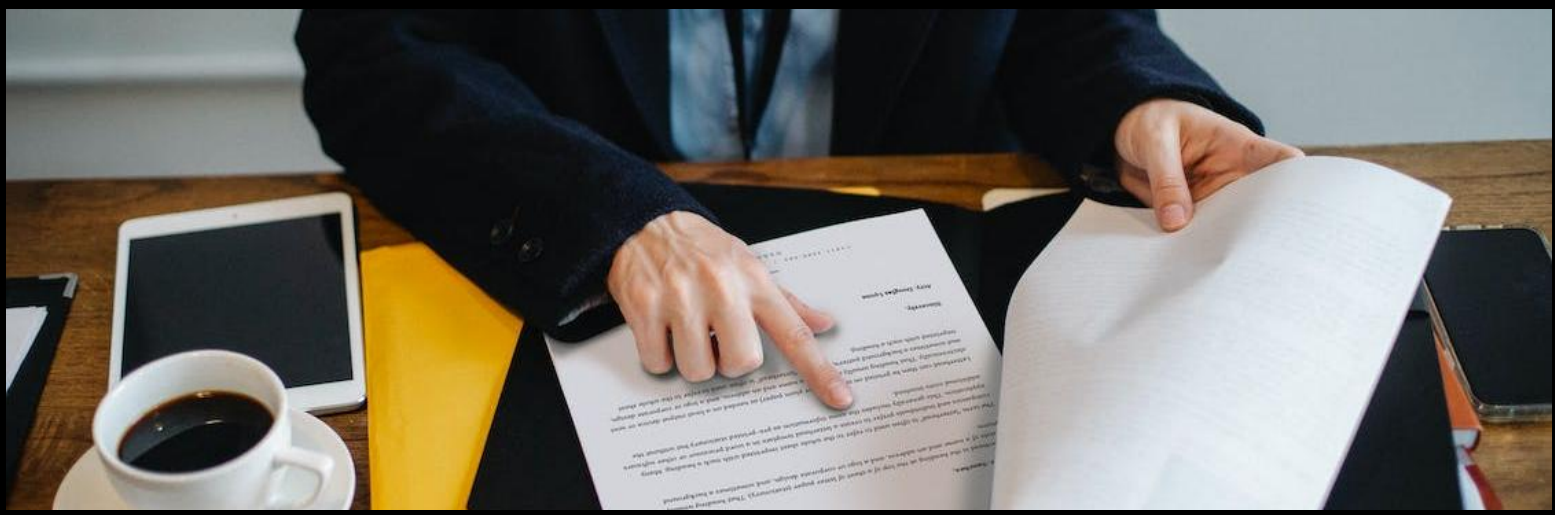
Candidates are permitted to refer to the following statutes during the examination:

CONTRACTS ACT 1950 | SPECIFIC RELIEF ACT 1950 | CIVIL LAW ACT 1956

Candidates will be provided with fresh copies of these statutes during the exam, and are *not* allowed to use their own copies.

SUBJECT OVERVIEW: LAW OF EVIDENCE

LAW OF EVIDENCE encompasses the study of substantive law and procedural rules governing the issue of admissibility of evidence in civil and criminal trials.



EXAMINATION FOCUS

- ❖ Thorough understanding of the law of evidence as in statutory provisions and case laws
- ❖ Analytical and creative thinking in applying the different laws to questions in exams

EXAMINATION FORMAT

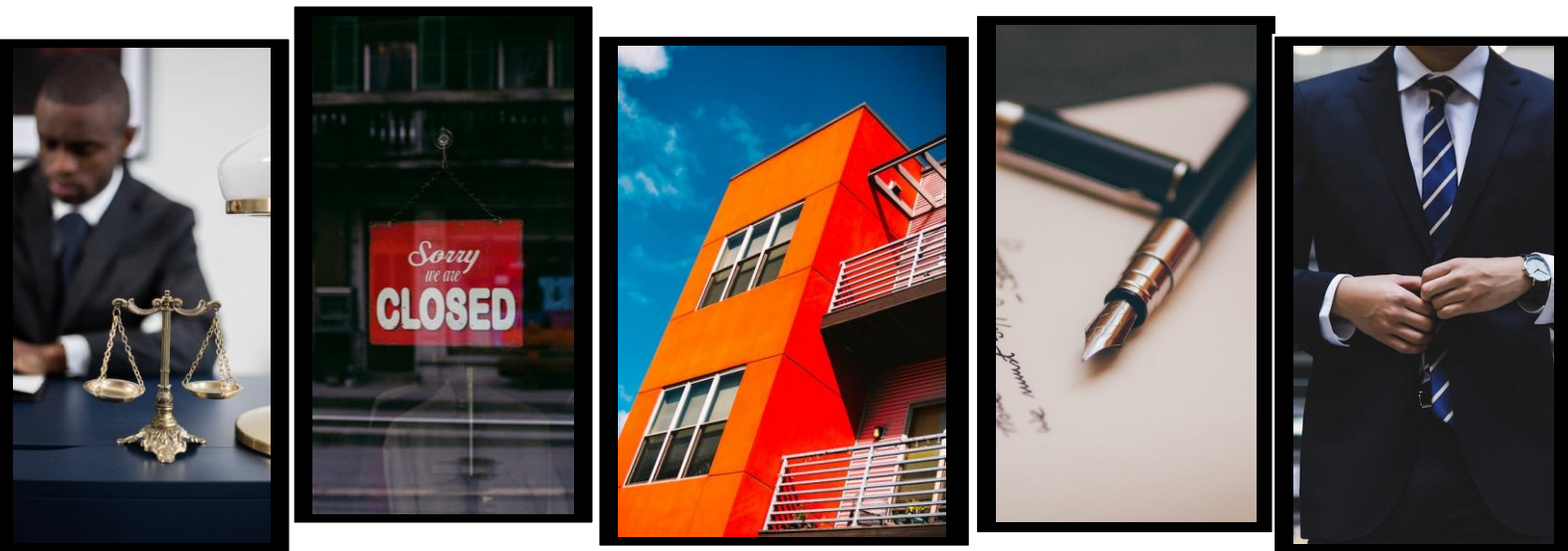
Seven (7) questions in total. Candidates must answer:

- **One (1) *unseen compulsory question***; and
- **Three (3) elective questions** (*chosen from the remaining 6*)

Candidates are allowed to refer to the **EVIDENCE ACT 1950**, which will be provided during the examination. Candidates are not allowed to bring their own copy of the said statute.

SUBJECT OVERVIEW: PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE

PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE encompasses the rules governing the professional conduct of practitioners in Malaysia, and substantive laws involved in key areas of practice in Malaysia. The subject is divided into five components; [1] Professional Ethics; [2] Advocacy; [3] Probate and administration of estates; [4] Law of Bankruptcy and Winding-up; and [5] Land law and land dealings



EXAMINATION FOCUS

- ❖ Familiarity with statutory provisions and case authorities in each area is imperative.
- ❖ Careful analysis of issues in questions and portray correct application of the law.

EXAMINATION FORMAT

The Professional Practice paper consists two (2) Parts.

Candidates must answer a total of FIVE (5) questions:

PART A: ETHICS AND ADVOCACY

TWO (2) questions must be answered from a selection of FOUR (4) questions

SECTION B: PROBATE, BANKRUPTCY/WINDING UP & LAND DEALINGS

THREE (3) questions must be answered from a selection of 5 questions

Candidates are allowed to refer to the following statutes which will be provided during examination: LEGAL PROFESSION ACT 1976 | INSOLVENCY ACT 1967 (including rules) | NATIONAL LAND CODE 2020
